

**X MONITORING AND REVIEW**

Vision 2010 is an ambitious attempt to chart the roadmap for the State's progress. It clearly delineates and emphasises critical aspects of the economy and governance that must be addressed to ensure rapid and balanced development in the State. Securing the path to development is imperative for the State to realise its goals.

In order to ensure that this Vision does not remain on paper, the State would put in place a dynamic institutional structure to oversee the implementation of the Vision. This would involve constant monitoring and periodic review. Monitoring would ensure that the pace of progress is critically observed and any corrective action required is taken. The State also recognises the paradigm of constant change and hence the need to have a periodic review of strategies and goals.

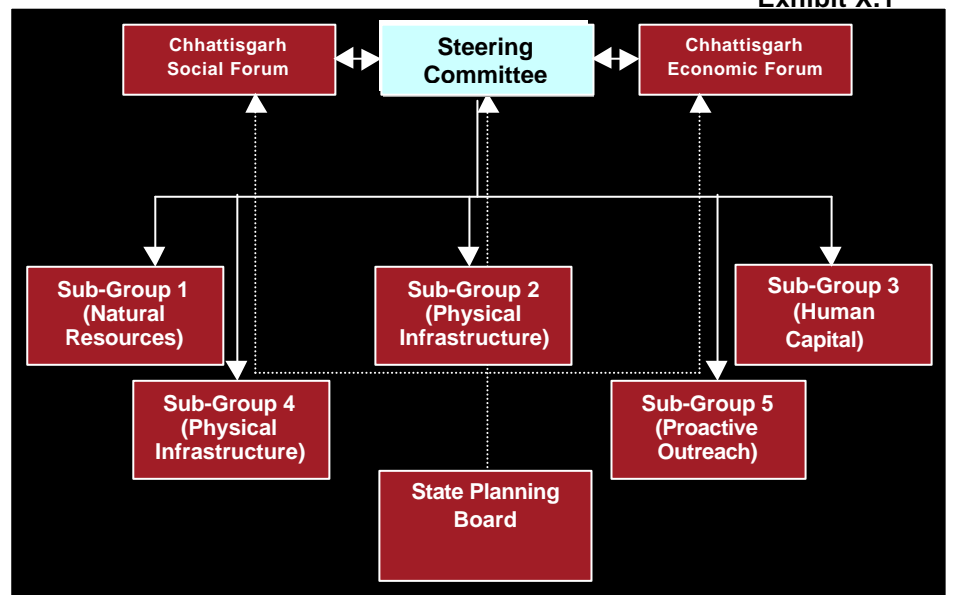
At the core of this monitoring and review structure would be a steering committee (Exhibit X.1), which would be chaired by the Chief Minister and would consist of the entire cabinet.

The role of this committee would be to:

- Plan, develop and review the Vision's action plan so as to achieve the desired economic and social objectives and to set-out arrangements and responsibilities for effective implementation
- Monitor the movement of key indicators and targets contained in Vision 2010
- Review the priorities and objectives of the vision

In order to ensure that this document does not remain a vision, the State would put in place a dynamic institutional structure to oversee the implementation of Vision 2010

The State also realises the need to gather inputs and views of a wide diaspora of society so as to ensure inclusion of various points of view that would ensure acceptance of the government policy for economic and social development. To further this aim, the State would set up two independent forums –social and economic.

While the Chhattisgarh Economic Forum would be represented by Industry Associations, CIDC, CSIDC, Banks, Financial Institutions and Development Finance Institutions, the Chhattisgarh Social Forum would be represented by NGOs, voluntary organisations, fourth estate, judiciary and concerned secretaries of the State.

The objective of this forum would be to elicit feedback on the impact of the various policies and programs of the State and suggestions on further improvement of the same from a wide spectrum of stakeholders in the State. This forum would serve to give the government a balanced scorecard on its performance. The committee would meet twice a year.

In order to facilitate these meetings, agenda paper and information requirements of the forum would be facilitated by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics in association with the State Planning Board – which would be the convening agency for the two forums.

To continuously monitor the progress of the State in attaining its growth targets – the Government would also constitute sub-groups each looking after the strategic levers identified in Vision 2010. The objectives of these sub-groups being:

- To oversee the implementation of the action steps identified in the Vision 2010 and also address potential road blocks and bottlenecks
- To report on the steps taken for reforms and the progress achieved therein on a quarterly basis, to the members of the steering committee in a prescribed format

All the sub-groups would be headed by the Chief Secretary and would be represented by Principal Secretary – Finance and secretaries along with the head of the concerned groups of department / State undertaking.

In addition to the above institutional mechanism, all government publications in the State including annual economic survey, department budgets, etc. would necessarily map the progress of the action plans relating to their respective sectors in their performance. This would ensure that each department also reviews its performance towards attainment of the growth targets and takes steps to address all issues therein.
